

NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

ANDINA PLC

(Incorporated and registered in England and Wales with registered number 08095058)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the 2013 annual general meeting of Andina plc (the "Company") will be held at the offices of Nabarro LLP at Lacon House, 84 Theobald's Road, London WC1X 8RW at 10.00 a.m. on 31 July 2013 for the following purposes:

Ordinary Business

To consider and, if thought fit, pass the following resolutions as ordinary resolutions:

1. That the audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2012 together with the reports of the directors and auditors thereon be received, considered and adopted.
2. That Neil Bleasdale, who was appointed by the board on 17 May 2013, be re-elected as a director.
3. That Jorge Depresbiteris, who was appointed by the board on 17 May 2013, be re-elected as a director.
4. That Marcelo Comba, who was appointed by the board on 17 May 2013, be re-elected as a director.
5. That Nexia Smith & Williamson be reappointed as the auditors of the Company to hold office from the conclusion of the meeting until the next annual general meeting at which accounts are laid before the Company.
6. That the directors be authorised to fix the auditors' remuneration.

Special Business

To consider and, if thought fit, pass the following resolutions of which resolution 7 will be proposed as an ordinary resolution and resolutions 8 and 9 as special resolutions:

7. That the Directors be and they are hereby generally and unconditionally authorised in accordance with section 551 of the Companies Act 2006 (the "2006 Act") in substitution for all existing authorities:

(a) to exercise all the powers of the Company to allot shares and to make offers or agreements to allot shares in the Company or grant rights to subscribe for or to convert any security into shares in the Company (together "Relevant Securities") up to an aggregate nominal amount of £9,615,611; and

(b) to exercise all the powers of the Company to allot equity securities (within the meaning of section 560 of the 2006 Act) up to an additional aggregate nominal amount of £2,884,683 provided that this authority may only be used in connection with a rights issue in favour of holders of ordinary shares and other persons entitled to participate therein where the equity securities respectively attributable to the interests of all those persons at such record dates as the Directors may determine are proportionate (as nearly as may be) to the respective numbers of equity securities held or deemed to be held by them or are otherwise allotted in accordance with the rights attaching to such equity securities subject to such exclusions or other arrangements as the Directors may consider necessary or expedient to deal with fractional entitlements or legal difficulties under the laws of any territory or the requirements of a regulatory body or stock exchange or by virtue of shares being represented by depositary receipts or any other matter whatsoever,

provided that the authorities in 7(a) and 7(b) shall expire at the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company after the passing of this resolution or if earlier on the date which is 15 months after the date of the annual general meeting, except that the Company may before such expiry make an offer or agreement which would or might require Relevant Securities or equity securities as the case may be to be allotted after such expiry and the Directors may allot Relevant Securities or equity securities in pursuance of any such offer or agreement as if the authority in question had not expired.

8. That, subject to the passing of resolution 7 as set out in the notice of this meeting, the directors be and are empowered, in accordance with sections 570 and 573 of the 2006 Act, to allot equity securities (as defined in section 560 of the 2006 Act) for cash pursuant to the authority conferred by resolution 7 or by way of a sale of treasury shares as if section 561(1) of the 2006 Act did not apply to any such allotment, provided that this power shall be limited to:

(a) the allotment of equity securities in connection with a rights issue or other pro rata offer (but in the case of the authority conferred by paragraph 7(b), by way of rights issue only) in favour of holders of ordinary shares and other persons entitled to participate therein where the equity securities respectively attributable to the interests of all those persons at such record dates as the directors may determine are proportionate (as nearly as may be) to the respective numbers of equity securities held or deemed to be held by them or are otherwise allotted in accordance with the rights attaching to such equity securities subject in each case to such exclusions or other arrangements as the directors may consider necessary or expedient to deal with fractional entitlements or legal difficulties under the laws of any territory or the requirements of a regulatory body or stock exchange or by virtue of shares being represented by depositary receipts or any other matter whatsoever; and

(b) the allotment (otherwise than pursuant to paragraph 8(a) above) of equity securities up to an aggregate nominal amount of £4,807,805,

and shall expire upon the expiry of the general authority conferred by resolution 7 above, except that the Company may make an offer or agreement before this power expires which would or might require equity securities to be allotted and/or shares held by the Company in treasury to be sold or transferred after such expiry and the directors may allot equity securities and/or sell or transfer shares held by the Company in treasury in pursuance of such offer or agreement as if the power conferred by this resolution had not expired.

9. That the Company be and is hereby generally and unconditionally authorised, in accordance with section 701 of the 2006 Act, to make market purchases (within the meaning of section 693(4) of the 2006 Act) of ordinary shares of 10 pence each in the capital of the Company ("**Ordinary Shares**") on such terms and in such manner as the Directors may from time to time determine provided that:

(a) the maximum number of Ordinary Shares authorised to be purchased is 14,400,000 (representing approximately 15% of the Company's issued share capital at the date of notice covering the annual general meeting at which this resolution is to be proposed;

(b) the minimum price which may be paid for an Ordinary Share is £0.10 (exclusive of expenses payable by the Company);

(c) the maximum price which may be paid for an Ordinary Share (exclusive of expenses payable by the Company) cannot be more than the higher of:

(i) 105 per cent. of the average market value of an Ordinary Share for the five business days prior to the day on which the Ordinary Share is contracted to be purchased; and

(ii) the value of an Ordinary Share calculated on the basis of the higher of:

- the last independent trade of; or
- the highest current independent bid for,

any number of Ordinary Shares on the trading venue where the market purchase by the Company will be carried out; and

the authority conferred shall expire at the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company except that the Company may before such expiry make a contract to purchase its own shares which will or may be completed or executed wholly or partly after such expiry.

NOTES

1. A member entitled to attend and vote at the meeting is entitled to appoint another person(s) (who need not be a member of the Company) to exercise all or any of his rights to attend, speak and vote at the meeting. A member can appoint more than one proxy in relation to the meeting, provided that each proxy is appointed to exercise the rights attaching to different shares held by him.
2. Your proxy could be the Chairman, another director of the Company or another person who has agreed to attend to represent you. Your proxy will vote as you instruct and must attend the meeting for your vote to be counted. Details of how to appoint the Chairman or another person as your proxy using the proxy form are set out in the notes to the proxy form. Appointing a proxy does not preclude you from attending the meeting and voting in person. If you attend the meeting in person, your proxy appointment will automatically be terminated.
3. An appointment of proxy is provided with this notice and instructions for use are shown on the form. In order to be valid, a completed appointment of proxy must be returned to the Company by one of the following methods:
 - (a) in hard copy form by post, by courier or (during normal business hours) by hand to the Company's registrars (Share Registrars Limited) at the address shown on the form of proxy; or
 - (b) when submitted by email, to the email address stated on the form of proxy; or
 - (c) in the case of CREST members, by utilising the CREST electronic proxy appointment service in accordance with the procedures set out below,and in each case must be received by the Company not less than 48 hours before the time fixed for the meeting. Please note that any electronic communication sent to our registrars in respect of the appointment of a proxy that is found to contain a computer virus will not be accepted.
4. To change your proxy instructions you may return a new proxy appointment using the methods set out above. Where you have appointed a proxy using the hard copy proxy form and would like to change the instructions using another hard copy proxy form, please contact the Company's registrars, Share Registrars Limited. The deadline for receipt of proxy appointments (see above) also applies in relation to amended instructions. Any attempt to terminate or amend a proxy appointment received after the relevant deadline will be disregarded. Where two or more valid separate appointments of proxy are received in respect of the same share in respect of the same meeting, the one which is last sent shall be treated as replacing and revoking the other or others.
5. Appointment of proxies via CREST:
 - (a) CREST members who wish to appoint a proxy or proxies by utilising the CREST electronic proxy appointment service may do so by utilising the procedures described in the CREST Manual. CREST Personal Members or other CREST sponsored members, and those CREST members who have appointed a voting service provider(s), should refer to their CREST sponsor or voting service provider(s), who will be able to take the appropriate action on their behalf.
 - (b) In order for a proxy appointment made by means of CREST to be valid, the appropriate CREST message (a "CREST Proxy Instruction") must be properly authenticated in accordance with Euroclear UK & Ireland's specifications and must contain the information required for such instructions, as described in the CREST Manual. The message, regardless of whether it constitutes the appointment of a proxy or an amendment to the instruction given to a previously appointed proxy, in order to be valid, must be transmitted so as to be received by the Company's agent (ID 7RA36) by the latest time for receipt of proxy appointments specified in the notice of meeting. For this purpose, the time of receipt will be taken to be the time (as determined by the timestamp applied to the message by the CREST Applications Host) from which the issuer's agent is able to retrieve the message by enquiry to CREST in the manner prescribed by CREST.
 - (c) The Company may treat as invalid a CREST Proxy Instruction in the circumstances set out in Regulation 35(5)(a) of the Uncertificated Securities Regulations 2001.
 - (d) CREST members and, where applicable, their CREST sponsors or voting service providers should note that Euroclear UK & Ireland does not make available special procedures in CREST for any particular messages. Normal system timings and limitations will therefore apply in relation to the input of CREST Proxy Instructions. It is the responsibility of the CREST member concerned to take (or, if the CREST member is a CREST personal member or sponsored member or has appointed a voting service provider(s), to procure that his CREST sponsor or voting service provider(s) take(s)) such action as shall be necessary to ensure that a message is transmitted by means of the CREST system by any particular time. In this connection, CREST members and, where applicable, their CREST sponsors or voting service providers are referred, in particular, to those sections of the CREST Manual concerning practical limitations of the CREST system and timings.
6. Only those shareholders registered in the Register of Members of the Company as at 6.00pm on 28 July 2013 (or, if the meeting is adjourned, on the date which is two days before the time of the adjourned meeting) shall be entitled to attend and vote at the meeting or adjourned meeting in respect of the number of shares registered in their respective names at that time. Changes to the Register of Members after that time will be disregarded in determining the rights of any person to attend or vote at the meeting or adjourned meeting.
7. Any corporation which is a member can appoint one or more corporate representatives who may exercise on its behalf all of its powers as a member provided that they do not do so in relation to the same shares.
8. Any member attending the meeting has the right to ask questions. The Company must cause to be answered any such question relating to the business being dealt with at the meeting but no such answer need be given if:
 - (a) to do so would interfere unduly with the preparation for the meeting or involve the disclosure of confidential information;
 - (b) the answer has already been given on a website in the form of an answer to a question; or
 - (c) it is undesirable in the interests of the Company or the good order of the meeting that the question be answered.
9. As at 8 July 2013 (being the last business day before the publication of this notice), the Company's issued share capital consisted of 96,156,114 ordinary shares carrying one vote each. Therefore the total voting rights in the Company are 96,156,114.
